Reporter Edward Lawrence and Photojournalist Mark Zamora **Thousands Apply for CityCenter Jobs**

The MGM-Mirage's CityCenter project which is seen as the possible spark for an economic turnaround in Las Vegas has had 120,000 applicants for jobs at the resort when it opens in December.

The employment center responsible for hiring the employees say they have done 25,000 interviews since February. The center will hire 10,000 people and other companies at CityCenter will hire an additional 2,000 workers.

"We are looking at statistics that indicate we are getting a large number of applicants from California, also Texas, and New York. The majority of our applicants are from Las Vegas and sister properties and competitors," said Kelley Tucky, CityCenter vice president of staffing.

At \$8.6 billion, CityCenter is the biggest privately funding project in the United States and it was only a few months ago there was uncertainty about its future.

Tucky says even with the uncertainty of the project, the applications poured in by the thousands. Hundreds of job seekers are still visiting the employment center daily.

CityCenter will not make actual job offers until the end of the summer. Applicants can still [apply for a job online](#).
